This study day will be of interest to Clinical Support Workers who are working in palliative and end of life care, including hospice, hospital, nursing/residential home or community settings.

About this course

Whatever the setting in which they work, clinical support workers are providing the 'hands on' day to day care of people dying of cancer or other life limiting conditions. This day will help participants to develop their skills and ability to fulfil this important role, and provide patients with individualised, appropriate and holistic end of life care. The day will cover the key building blocks of palliative care - holistic nursing care and communication skills.

- Further their knowledge of the needs of dying individuals
